A MESSAGE FROM OUR RABBI

SUMMERTIME AND THE LIVIN' IS JEWISH

Here are just a few reasons why the title of this article can prove true.

1 Summer Camp. Many of our members send their children to Jewish summer camp and to camps that are not officially Jewish but include Friday night services, bar/bat mitzvah tutoring, and Jewish songs. A few of our adult members still go to camp! (Andy Kaufman has been a camp doctor for many years. Jill Hayden teaches art, Barry Alpert teaches woodworking, and Karen Weiss, our Hebrew School principal, is a supervisor at camp.) Jewish camp is a great way to make friends, have fun, and develop skills and independence, all while strengthening Jewish learning and identity. Children who attend Jewish summer camp are 45% more likely than their peers to attend synagogue as adults. If you are new to Jewish camping, you are not alone. Over 20,000 American kids attended Jewish camp *for the first time* during each of the last two summers. 2 Lighter Schedules & Shabbos. Lighter schedules can mean more leisure to

really enter into Shabbos. Shabbat begins later, so you don't feel you have "missed it" because the sun went down two hours before your office closed. CBI is sponsoring home hospitality for Shabbat meals and get-togethers over the summer. See the Ritual article later in this issue, and please join us! You can take a hand in helping to lead the prayers or a Torah discussion or d'var Torah (sermon) on a Friday night when our clergy are out of town. The smaller summer crowd will be welcoming and supportive, and the learning you gain will be priceless. Please contact the Ritual committee to participate.

The word Shabbat/Shabbos can be translated as pause, rest, or sit. Over the summer, many of us take a breather from our usual hectic schedules. When you are on vacation or sitting and relaxing at home, make that time even more restful and meaningful by lighting Shabbat candles, singing a Shabbat song, blessing your kids, and joining with your family and community in prayer.

3 Lighter Schedules & Torah. Leisure hours in the summer also afford more time for reading and learning. Many Jews follow a "daf (page) a day" regimen in reading difficult texts, such as the Talmud. My uncle got through the entire Encyclopedia Judaica on a "daf a day" program. Many people like to study a chapter of Bible or a psalm each day. You can also read a chapter

per week of a more accessible and popular Jewish book. Please feel free to call or email me for suggestions based on your interests.

If you have children in Hebrew School, it's easy to make this a family project. At the end of our Hebrew School year, all our Hebrew School students received a reading list of engaging Jewish books and Hebrew language online games and apps for their ages, along with their "moving up" certificates. Reading a Jewish book aloud as a family on Shabbat is one of my favorite customs from childhood, which I have continued with my children. Please feel free to call or email me if you want help in finding just the right book for your family.

4 High Holiday Preparation. Believe it or not, it's not too early to begin preparing for the High Holidays, both communally and personally. Are you able to participate by serving as an usher (contact Meryl at meryl.kutzin@bisrael.com), volunteering at our children's service (contact our Education Committee at education.chair@bisrael.com), reading from the Torah or Haftarah (contact our Ritual Committee at ritual.chair@bisrael.com) or helping to get the building ready for our largest crowds of the year (contact our House & Grounds Committee at houseandgrounds.chair@bisrael.com)? There are many ways to get involved!

Tisha B'av falls this year on July 25. In the weeks leading up to this day, which commemorates the destruction of the Temples in Jerusalem, we mourn the human capacity for destructiveness. The tradition also calls upon us to own that quality in ourselves, facing it squarely and considering how to overcome it. August 15 marks the first day of Elul, the month that is traditionally devoted to reviewing the past year. BAT/BAR MITZVAH MESSAGE

MADLINE ROSENTHAL

My name is Maddie Rosenthal and I am proud to say that I will become a Bat Mitzvah on Saturday, June 6th 2015. In my Torah portion, B'ha-alot'kha, Moses and the Israelites are wandering through the desert with only manna as food. As I read through my portion, I recognized that the Israelites complained too much and did not see how much they had in front of them. A lot more of my Torah portion can be found in the book of Numbers, where it talks about complaining and the real definition of it.

In my Torah portion, the Israelites complained about how they missed the meats and vegetables that they had in Egypt. What they didn't understand was that they just were freed out of slavery. The Israelites didn't realize that they were just given a miracle from God. God just freed them out of Egypt, but they had to still complain about their unhappiness with manna.

Looking at 2015 today, all you see is technology. I guess that is a good thing but sometimes it can take control of you. For example, while you're complaining about that new iPhone case that you've been begging for, someone in New York is begging for a dollar so they can still try to support their family. We are all so lucky to have a roof over our head, food on our plate, good health, and loved ones. Some people forget that and don't see the bigger picture. Maybe, sometimes individuals have to look beyond what they want and see what they already have that others don't.

For my Mitzvah project, I hosted a fundraiser for Rett Syndrome using my passion for lacrosse and raised almost \$2,000. Rett Syndrome is an "all-girl" disease affecting the nervous system. Why did I choose this? A very close family friend who is my age, has this degenerative neurological disorder. Rett Syndrome doesn't only affect the girl suffering from it, but

the entire family. It's not easy raising a child with a disability.

Eric and Robin Diamond have a beautiful daughter named Abby who has Rett Syndrome. This is difficult for the family, but Eric, Robin, and their daughter Jillian work hard to have an optimistic attitude. Positive and proud, Robin shared many stories about her daughter with me: "One of Abby's biggest achievements is never forgetting what she learned yesterday. She improves every day." The reason I chose this cause is because I look up to this family. I don't know how they do it but I never see them complain. Almost every time I've seen the Diamonds they are either getting ready to host a Rett event or just looking at their daughter with pride.

I would love for you all to come to morning Minyan on Sunday, May 31st. Also, come to my Friday night service, June 5th and my Shabbat morning service on Saturday, June 6th. Thank you and I hope to see you there.
