## A MESSAGE FROM OUR RABBI

### ABSOLUT PURIM

Purim is our most important holiday – and not just because it involves liquor. Purim is *frailach*, meaning joyful.<sup>2</sup> It is full of humorous and delightful traditions, including song parodies by the cantor,<sup>3</sup> Haman-induced migraines, a delicious cookie fashioned after the ear of your enemy,<sup>4</sup> and late bed-times for over-tired children who are encouraged by the synagogue to cannibalize Haman, enjoy the sugar rush, and drown out his name with their screams.<sup>5</sup> The Talmud teaches that it may be the only holiday that will persist even after the Messiah comes.<sup>6</sup> Purim lets us know that everything can turn around in the blink of an eye. One day, you can be a respected leader, and the next day, you can be swinging from the gallows. Wait a minute... That doesn't sound as *frailach* as advertised. I guess

the point is that life is joyful and full of hope, and a miracle can always turn things around, as long as you are not an egomaniacal Amalekite.<sup>7</sup>

In the shtetl, to re-enact the reversals of fortune that occur in the Book of Esther, men would dress up as women on Purim, and students would impersonate and parody their rabbis.<sup>8</sup> If we were to follow that tradition at CBI, I wonder which of the Sunday morning minyan-aires might win the beauty contest?<sup>9</sup> Other reversals: I could memorize every joke and song in creation and then tell & hum a few as I “knock back a few” in the kitchen after services. Our good cantor might introduce the Shema (again!) and, uncharacteristically, require a microphone.

One mitzvah associated with Purim is hearing the Megillah read.<sup>10</sup> Another is giving gifts to the poor, in gratitude for all the years of poverty we were privileged to live through as a people, after Esther and Mordecai saved us from a quick and easy

death.<sup>11</sup> Perhaps the best-loved mitzvah of Purim is “*mischloach manot*.”<sup>12</sup> In this custom (not unlike the Christian fruitcake tradition), Jews send food to one another, which may either be passed on to another *yutz* or eaten oneself.<sup>13</sup> At CBI, Robin Pierce and her committee will add foods from the Land of Israel,<sup>14</sup> a lovely note, and (if I have my way this year) a packet of tums.

I am guilty of a snide tone, but the truth is, I love Purim. Purim really is full of delights. We celebrate Jewish women who are simultaneously beautiful and powerful.<sup>15</sup> We remember that each of us is sent here for a purpose, and sometimes it takes a crisis to show us what that purpose is. We experience laughter as a way of bonding together, and a way of thumbing our noses, collectively, at evil. Take that, Haman. We not only refuse to die, we insist on drinking a l'chaim, telling jokes, singing songs, and enjoying a great time together.<sup>16</sup>

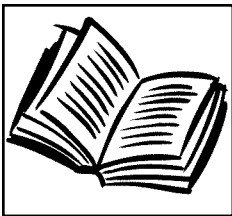

## The Children of Israel


